The bridle paths were likely laid out between 1926 and 1928, and were part of the City's original recreational infrastructure gifted to the people of San Clemente by Ole Hanson. According to the original San Clemente Plat map, circa 1926, bridle paths were planned for Esplanade from El Camino Real to the beach; Paseo de Cristobol from Esplanade to Avenida Valencia; Avenida Valencia from Paseo de Cristobol to El Camino Real; and S Ola Vista from Avenida Valencia to Junipero Serra. An additional path traversed the canyon above S Ola Vista between W Avenidos De Los Lobos Marinos and W Avenida San Antonio. The original sites of the bridle paths, since replaced with landscape medians, appear eligible as contributors to a potential local historic district under Criterion A for their association with the Ole Hanson/Spanish Village by the Sea period of development. They are recommended for addition to the Historic Structures List.
