P3a. Description:

The property contains a one-story commercial building composed of two distinct sections. The southeasternmost portion of the property, now the Blue Danube Restaurant, contains elements of the City's original fire station. The Spanish Colonial Revival style building features a rectangular plan and wood-frame construction. It features original shed and gabled roofs clad with clay tile. An original square stucco-clad tower is capped by a rounded roof set upon four wood spindled posts. Exterior walls are clad with smooth stucco. The primary facade, facing Avenida Miramar, consists of multiple non-original arched openings. A non-original wood-beam trellis supported by head stucco piers spans the full width of the primary facade. At the time of this Survey Update, this portion of the property was under construction.

P3a. DESCRIPTION (continued).

The remainder of the property consists of an attached shopping plaza constructed in the 1970s. This building has a U-shaped plan and wood-frame construction. The building is arranged around a central parking area and contains multiple storefronts occupied by shops and restaurants. It has a shed roof clad with clay tile. The roof shelters an arcade along the entire interior facade of the building, supported by square wood posts with diagonal braces. The exterior walls are clad with rough-finish stucco. Decorative features include exposed rafter tails. The fenestration consists of wood-frame windows throughout the building. The storefront windows include original wood frames, and original transom windows over doorways.

The property is in good condition. Its integrity is fair due to alterations and additions.

This one-story commercial building contains remnants of San Clemente's original fire station, constructed in 1928, with an addition of the police department and city jail in the 1940s. This property is a unique example of the Spanish Colonial Revival style as represented in San Clemente. Despite alterations and later additions, this property appears eligible as a contributor to a potential historic district under Criterion A for its association with the Ole Hanson/Spanish Village by the Sea period of development. It is recommended for retention on the Historic Structures List.


